## ITINERARY

25 November

Morning, fly from Yangon to Bagan and proceed from Bagan to Natmataung (Mt. Victoria) National Park. Overnight at Mountain Oasis Resort, this is situated near the boundary of the park.

26 to 30 November

Birding at Natmataung National Park (Mt. Victoria).

1 December

Drive back to Bagan. Overnight at Thande hotel in Bagan

2 December

Fly back from Bagan to Yangon

## NOTES ON SITE VISIT IN SOUTHERN CHIN HILLS

Bird watching was conducted at Natmataung (Mt. Victoria) National Park in the southern Chin Hills. Natmataung is established in 1994 encompasses an area of 722.61 sq km of mountainous terrain including Mount Victoria (Natmataung) with the elevation of 3054m, the highest mountain in West and Central Myanmar. The park located at 21° 19' N and 93° 55' E in Chin State, north-western part of Myanmar. This park falls within the Eastern Himalayas Endemic Bird Area, which is covered by hill savannah, hill evergreen, moist upper mixed deciduous and pine forests.

Birding was conducted five full days at South-east part of Natmataung. The distant of birding route is about 22 km and between 1700 and 2750 masl. Detail are:

**26 November** – between 8 Mile Camp (~2500m) and Topmost Picnic Area (mile 10/3 at 2750m)

**27 November** – between Topmost Picnic Area and mile 11/7 (~2630m).

**28 November** – in the morning around Forest Guest House (~1900m) and in the afternoon from Forest Guest House to Mountain Oasis Resort (~1700m)

**29 November** – in the morning from mile 2/4 (~2250 m) to mile 4/0 (~2440m) and in the afternoon from mile 2/4 to mile 0/6 (~2080m)

**30 November** – in the morning around 8 Mile Camp and in the afternoon down from mile 3/0 to Forest Guest House

## RECORDED BIRD SPECIES

During the trip we recorded a total of 140 bird species. Details are:

### PHASIANIDAE: PERDICINAE: Partridges, francolins, quails

**Hill Partridge** *Arborophila torqueola*

Head at Topmost Picnic Area on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

**Mountain Bamboo Partridge** *Bambusicola fytchii*

Head on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 3 seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

### PHASIANINAE: Pheasants & Junglefowl

**Blyth's Tragopan** *Tragopan blythii*

Head near 8 Mile Camp on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Kalij Pheasant** *Lophura leucomelanos*

A pair seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

**Mrs Hume's Pheasant** *Syrmaticus humiae*

One male seen near 8MC on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**FALCONIDAE: FALCONINAE: Falcons**

**Common Kestrel** *Falco tinnunculus*

Single ones seen at Mountain Oasis Resort on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Oriental Hobby** *Falco severus*

Single ones seen near 8MC on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>.

**FALCONIDAE: ACCIPITRINAE: Hawks, eagles & allies**

**Oriental Honey-buzzard** *Pernis ptilorhynchus*

One seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Crested Goshawk** *Accipiter trivirgatus*

One seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Himalayan Buzzard** *Buteo burmanicus*

Single ones seen on most days.

**Black Eagle** *Ictinaetus malayensis*

Single ones seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, and a flock of four birds seen at TPA on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**COLUMBIDAE: COLUMBINAE: Typical pigeons & doves**

**Ashy Woodpigeon** *Columba pulchricollis*

A flock of eight near TPA on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Spotted Dove** *Streptopelia chinensis*

One seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**COLUMBIDAE: TRERONINAE: Green-pigeons, fruit-doves, imperial-pigeons & allies**

**Wedge-tailed Green-pigeon** *Treron sphenura*

One seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**CUCULIDAE: CUCULINAE: Old World cuckoos**

**Drongo Cuckoo** *Surniculus lugubris*

One seen near MOR on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**RAMPHASTIDAE: MEGALAIMINAE: Asian barbets**

**Great Barbet** *Megalaima virens*

Up to 52 birds seen on 5 days.

**Golden-throated Barbet** *Megalaima franklinii*

Up to 5 seen daily with an exceptional 31 birds on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Blue-throated Barbet** *Megalaima asiatica*

One seen near MOR on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**PICIDAE: PICINAE: Typical woodpeckers**

**Rufous-bellied Woodpecker** *Hypopicus hyperythrus*

A pair seen on the 26<sup>th</sup> and up to 9 recorded on the 9<sup>th</sup>.

**Fulvous-breasted Woodpecker** *Dendrocopos macei*

One male seen near Forest Guest House at 1900 masl on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Stripe-breasted Woodpecker** *Dendrocopos atratus*

One female seen near Forest Guest House at 1900 masl on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Crimson-breasted Woodpecker** *Dendrocopos cathpharius*

One male seen near FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup> and up to four birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Darjeeling Woodpecker** *Dendrocopos darjellensis*

One male seen near 8MC on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Greater Yellownape** *Chrysophlegma flavinucha*

One female seen near FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Lesser Yellownape** *Picus chlorolophus*

A pair seen near FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Bay Woodpecker** *Blythipicus pyrrhotis*

Heard daily with 2 birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**VIREONIDAE: Shrike-babblers, White-bellied Erpornis & allies**

**Black-headed Shrike-babbler** *Pteruthius rufiventer*

Six birds seen near TPA at 2700m on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**White-browed Shrike-babbler** *Pteruthius flaviscapis*

Head on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>, five birds seen near TPA at 2700m on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 4 on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Green Shrike-babbler** *Pteruthius xanthochlorus*

One seen on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Black-eared Shrike-babbler** *Pteruthius melanotis*

A total of 14 birds recorded on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 6 birds on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**CAMPEPHAGIDAE: Cuckooshrikes, trillers, minivets & allies**

**Large Cuckooshrike** *Coracina macei*

Three seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and two on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Grey-chinned Minivet** *Pericrocotus solaris*

Three seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Long-tailed Minivet** *Pericrocotus ethologus*

Daily seen with up to 38 birds recorded on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Short-billed Minivet** *Pericrocotus brevirostris*

One seen on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 5 birds on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**ORIOOLIDAE: Orioles & allies**

**Slender-billed Oriole** *Oriolus tenuirostris*

4 seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Maroon Oriole** *Oriolus traillii*

Daily seen with up to 5 birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**RHIPIDURIDAE: Fantails**

**Yellow-bellied Fantail** *Chelidorhynch hypoxantha*

Daily seen.

**White-throated Fantail** *Rhipidura albicollis*

Single ones seen on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> and two birds on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**DICRURIDAE: Drongos**

**Ashy Drongo** *Dicrurus leucophaeus*

Daily seen.

**Hair-crested Drongo** *Dicrurus hottentottus*

Daily seen with up to 46 birds recorded on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**CORVIDAE: Crows, nutcrackers, magpies, jays, treepies & allies**

**Eastern Jungle Crow** *Corvus levaillantii*

Split from Large-billed Crow.

Daily seen.

**Yellow-billed Blue Magpie** *Urocissa flavirostris*

A flock of 6 birds seen at 8MK on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 3 birds at TPA on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Red-billed Blue Magpie** *Urocissa erythrorhyncha*

A flock of six birds seen at MOR on the 27<sup>th</sup>, a total of 11 birds and 14 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> respectively.

**Grey Treepie** *Dendrocitta formosae*

7 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>, 6 on 29<sup>th</sup> and 20 on 30<sup>th</sup>.

**NECTARINIIDAE: Sunbirds & spiderhunters**

**Mrs Gould's Sunbird** *Aethopyga gouldiae*

Four birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Green-tailed Sunbird** *Aethopyga nipalensis*

Daily seen with up to 10 birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Black-throated Sunbird** *Aethopyga saturate*

One male seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Fire-tailed Sunbird** *Aethopyga ignicauda*

8 birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 14 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and a pair on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**DICAEIDAE: Flowerpeckers**

**Yellow-bellied Flowerpecker** *Dicaeum melanoxanthum*

One male seen on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Yellow-vented Flowerpecker** *Dicaeum chrysorrheum*

One bird seen near MOR at 1700m on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Fire-breasted Flowerpecker** *Dicaeum ignipectus*

One male seen on the 27<sup>th</sup> and a pair on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**CHLOROPSEIDAE: Leafbirds**

**Golden-fronted Leafbird** *Chloropsis aurifrons*

3 birds seen near FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Orange-bellied Leafbird** *Chloropsis hardwickii*

Single bird seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**MOTACILLIDAE: Wagtails & pipits**

**Olive-backed Pipit** *Anthus hodgsoni*

Daily seen.

**Grey Wagtail** *Motacilla cinerea*

Single ones seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>.

**FRINGILLIDAE: CARDUELINAE: Siskins, serins, finches, grosbeaks & allies**

**Yellow-breasted Greenfinch** *Chloris spinoides*

Head on the 26<sup>th</sup> and a flock of 4 birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Common Rosefinch** *Carpodacus erythrinus*

Up to 7 birds seen near the FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**EMBERIZIDAE: Buntings & allies**

**Little Bunting** *Emberiza pusilla*

Daily seen with up to 54 birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

**Chestnut Bunting** *Emberiza rutila*

Up to 8 birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**CERTHIDAE: CERTHINAE: Treecreepers**

**Bar-tailed Treecreeper** *Certhia himalayana*

Four birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, one on the 27<sup>th</sup>, two on the 29<sup>th</sup> and one on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Hume's Treecreeper** *Certhia manipurensis*

Daily seen with up to 10 birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**SITTIDAE: Nuthatches**

**Chestnut-vented Nuthatch** *Sitta nagaensis*

Daily seen with up to 18 birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**White-browed Nuthatch** *Sitta victoriae* (Endemic Species of Myanmar)

Three birds seen at 8MC on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 4 birds seen near TPA on the 27<sup>th</sup> and up to 5 birds recorded near 8MC on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**STURNIDAE: STURNINAE: Mynas, starlings & allies**

**Common Hill Myna** *Gracula religiosa*

Head at MOR on the 26<sup>th</sup> and at least 50 birds seen near FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**TURDIDAE: Thrushes, cochoas, grandala & allies**

**Grey-sided Thrush** *Turdus feae*

A flock of 8 birds seen at 8MC on the 26<sup>th</sup> and one seen near TPA at 2700m on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Eyebrowed Thrush** *Turdus obscurus*

Two birds seen near FGH on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**MUSCICAPIDAE: SAXICOLINAE: Shortwings, robins, redstarts, rock-thrushes, chats, forktails, whistling-thrushes & allies**

**Blue-fronted Redstart** *Phoenicurus frontalis*

Single males seen on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>, a pair on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

**Chestnut-bellied Rock-thrush** *Monticola rufiventris*

One or three birds seen daily.

**Grey Bushchat** *Saxicola ferreus*

Daily seen with up to 20 birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Himalayan Bluetail** *Tarsiger rufilatus*

Daily seen with up to 8 birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**White-crowned Forktail** *Enicurus leschenaultia*

One bird seen near FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Spotted Forktail** *Enicurus maculatus*

One bird seen near mile 11/7 at 2630m on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**MUSCICAPIDAE: MUSCICAPINAE: Old World flycatchers & allies**

**Hill Blue Flycatcher** *Cyornis banyumas*

One male seen at TPA on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Blue-throated Flycatcher** *Cyornis rubeculoides*

Two males and one female seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and one male seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Verditer Flycatcher** *Eumyias thalassinus*

Two seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and one on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Vivid Niltava** *Niltava vivida*

One male seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Slaty-backed Flycatcher** *Ficedula hodgsonii*

Up to four birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup> and a pair seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Slaty-blue Flycatcher** *Ficedula tricolor*

A pair seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Taiga Flycatcher** *Ficedula albicilla*

Daily seen.

**Rufous-gorgeted Flycatcher** *Muscicapa strophinata*

One or two birds seen daily.

**Dark-sided Flycatcher** *Muscicapa sibirica*

One bird seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

**PARINAE: Typical tits**

**Black-bibbed Tit** *Poecile hypermelaena*

Up to five birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, two birds on the 27<sup>th</sup> and four birds on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

Daily seen with up to 19 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Yellow-browed Tit** *Sylviparus modestus*

One bird seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

**STENOSTIRIDAE: Canary-flycatchers & allies**

**Grey-headed Canary-flycatcher** *Culicicapa ceylonensis*

Up to 5 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and single bird on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**PYCNONOTIDAE: Bulbuls**

**Crested Finchbill** *Spizixos canifrons*

15 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>, 29 birds on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 9 birds on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Striated Bulbul** *Pycnonotus striatus*

2 birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 11 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 20 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Black-crested Bulbul** *Pycnonotus flaviventris*

Three birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Flavescent Bulbul** *Pycnonotus flavescens*

Three birds seen at MOR on the 25<sup>th</sup>, one on the 28<sup>th</sup> and seven on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Red-vented Bulbul** *Pycnonotus cafer*

Four birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Mountain Bulbul** *Ixos mccllellandii*

A flock of 6 birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Himalayan Black Bulbul** *Hypsipetes leucocephalus*  
Daily seen with up to 40 birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**HIRUNDINIDAE: HIRUNDININAE: Martins, swallows & allies**

**Nepal House Martin** *Delichon nipalense*  
A total of 50 birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**CETTIIDAE: *Abroscopus* warblers, Mountain Tailorbird, Broad-billed Warbler, Cettia bush-warblers, tesias & allies**

**Black-faced Warbler** *Abroscopus schisticeps*  
Two birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Broad-billed Warbler** *Tickellia hodgsoni*  
Head on two days and one bird seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Brownish-flanked Bush-warbler** *Cettia fortipes*  
Two birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Chestnut-headed Tesia** *Tesia castaneocoronata*  
Daily seen with up to 11 birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**AEGITHALIDAE: Long-tailed tits**

**Burmese Tit** *Aegithalos sharpie* (Endemic Species)  
Split from Black-browed Tit.

A flock of 12 birds seen near 8MC and up to 60 birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**PHYLLOSCOPIDAE: *Seicercus* & *Phylloscopus* warblers**

**Whistler's Warbler** *Seicercus whistleri*

Two birds seen on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Grey-crowned Warbler** *Seicercus tephrocephalus*

Two birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Grey-hooded Warbler** *Phylloscopus xanthoschistus*

Two birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>, three on the 29<sup>th</sup> and two on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Blyth's Leaf-warbler** *Phylloscopus reguloides*

Daily seen with up to 43 birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Greenish Warbler** *Phylloscopus trochiloides*

Single ones seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Two-barred Warbler** *Phylloscopus plumbeitarsus*

Single ones seen on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Ashy-throated Warbler** *Phylloscopus maculipennis*

Two birds seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Buff-barred Warbler** *Phylloscopus pulcher*

8 birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 16 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and one on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Yellow-browed Warbler** *Phylloscopus inornatus*

Daily seen.

**Hume's Warbler** *Phylloscopus humei*

14 birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 10 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 5 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Tickell's Leaf-warbler** *Phylloscopus affinis*

Single ones seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> and three birds on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**TIMALIIDAE: Babblers**

**White-browed Fulvetta** *Fulvetta vinipectus*

25 birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, up to 50 birds on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 4 on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 9 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Chestnut-flanked White-eye** *Zosterops erythropleurus*

5 birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 12 on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 10 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Japanese White-eye** *Zosterops japonicas*

7 birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 4 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 8 on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Stripe-throated Yuhina** *Yuhina gularis*

2 birds seen on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Whiskered Yuhina** *Yuhina flavicollis*

Head on the 26<sup>th</sup>, up to 13 birds seen on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 2 on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 7 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Nepal Fulvetta** *Alcippe nipalensis*

14 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Rusty-capped Fulvetta** *Schoeniparus dubius*

Two birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Grey-throated Babbler** *Stachyris nigriceps*

5 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and one on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Spot-breasted Scimitar-babbler** *Pomatorhinus maclellandi*

Head near FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**White-browed Scimitar-babbler** *Pomatorhinus schisticeps*

15 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>, 4 on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Streak-breasted Scimitar-babbler** *Pomatorhinus ruficollis*

Head near FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup>, 5 birds seen on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 7 birds on the 29<sup>th</sup> and one on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Coral-billed Scimitar-babbler** *Pomatorhinus ferruginosus*

Two birds seen near FGH on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Chin Hills Wren-babbler** *Spelaeorhis oatesi* (Near Endemic)

Split from Long-tailed Wren-babbler.

Daily seen with up to 18 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Pygmy Wren-babbler** *Pnoepyga pusilla*

One bird seen near TPA on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Golden Babbler** *Stachyridopsis chrysaea*

Head on the 27<sup>th</sup>, single ones seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, and 4 birds seen on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Rufous-winged Fulvetta** *Pseudominla castaneiceps*

15 birds seen on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 4 on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 10 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Mt. Victoria Babax** *Babax woodi* (Near Endemic)

Split from Chinese Babax.

Three birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, one bird on the 27<sup>th</sup> and four bird on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Brown-capped Laughingthrush** *Trochalopteron austeni* (Near Endemic)

8 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Assam Laughingthrush** *Trochalopteron chrysopterum* (Near Endemic)

Split from Chestnut-crowned Laughingthrush.

Daily seen with up to 50 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Crimson-faced Liocichla** *Liocichla phoenicea*

Split from Red-faced Liocichla.

4 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Bar-throated Minla** *Chrysominla strigula*

10 birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 35 on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 10 on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 2 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Red-tailed Minla** *Minla ignotincta*

20 birds seen on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 9 birds on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Blue-winged Siva** *Siva cyanouroptera*

4 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 17 on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Silver-eared Mesia** *Mesia argentauris*

20 birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Grey Sibia** *Malacias gracilis*

Daily seen with up to 67 birds recorded on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Rufous-backed Sibia** *Leioptila annectens*

Two birds seen on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Streak-throated Barwing** *Actinodura waldeni*

Four birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup> and three birds on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Rusty-fronted Barwing** *Actinodura egertoni*

Two birds seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and one on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

**MEGALURIDAE: Grasshopper warblers, *Bradypterus* bush-warblers, Striated Grassbird & allies**

**Brown Bush-warbler** *Bradypterus luteoventris*

Single bird seen near 8MC on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**CISTICOLIDAE: Cisticolas, tailorbirds, prinias & allies**

**Striated Prinia** *Prinia crinigera*

One birds seen at FGH on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Black-throated Prinia** *Prinia atrogularis* (Near Endemic)

Split from Hill Prinia.

Three birds seen on the 26<sup>th</sup> and one bird on the 28<sup>th</sup>.
